Teachers/staff are also available via email, telephone, or by appointment at other times during the day.*
- 5. Provide parents opportunities to volunteer and participate in their child's class, and to observe classroom activities, as follows: We will solicit parent participation via volunteer forms at the beginning of the school year, communicate regularly with parents regarding their opportunities for classroom involvement, site committees and meetings for families and make parents feel welcome at school.

Parent Responsibilities

- Monitoring my child's attendance.
- Making sure to check my child's backpack for important papers.
- Volunteering in my child's classroom, to the extent possible.
